
BEWARE: We now have Resident

Raising The Rates!



Alas, real life in the form of price increases is rearing its ugly head again after a long hiatus. Accordingly, after lowering the monthly dues twice, the Board feels constrained to raise 'em back up a bit.

Service contracts here at HP have an escalator of 3% to 5% per year built into them, while water/sewer and garbage collection cost more than anticipated.

So in January, 2015, dues will go up twenty bucks from \$425 to \$445, with the same \$16 thrown in for Marina maintenance, and the same \$77 for slip owners. If you're a non-slipper, you'll be paying \$461/month instead of November's \$441.
